Windows Keyboard Shortcuts

The CTRL and ALT Keys


Since the beginning of computer-time, keyboards have had two keys on either side of the SPACEBAR that when pressed by themselves, don't do a darn thing! I'm referring to the **CTRL** and **ALT** keys. Instead of working by themselves, they are **used in combination with other keys** to quickly do certain tasks (shortcuts).

The WIN key

This key was added to keyboards in the 1990's as another key that Windows users could use in combination with other keys to do tasks.

ESC and "F" Keys

These keys are at the top of the keyboard, and work in various ways depending upon the program you are using.



How to "do" the shortcuts

Doing a keyboard shortcut is NOT the processing of trying to press both keys at exactly the same time! Instead do this...

- (1) Hold down the first key (such as CTRL)
- (2) Press and release the 2nd key (such as **C**)(do NOT hold it down, just press and let go)
- (3) Let go of the first key

WIN + E	Open My Computer
CTRL + F4	Close a file
ALT + F4	Close the entire program
CTRL + (+) OR (-)	Zoom in and out of display
CTRL + mouse wheel	Zoom in and out of display
WIN + F	Open the "Find" window
CTRL + ALT + DEL	Display the Task Manager menu
F1	Display help
Esc	Cancel and operation
